

## future—repair—machine INTRODUCTION

**future—repair—machine** creates a collective cultural framework to explore **repair** as a process to trigger change — in a world in need of restoration.

Together we redefine **repair** as a multifaceted tool for change within our shared spaces.



Repair is the process by which a damaged object is restored to a state in which it can fulfill its intended function, but the Latin origin of the word reparare not only means restoring and repairing, but also renewing a higher innovative power, because unlike recycling, it can not take things back to the starting point, but can continue to evolve.

It is a sustainable concept that values the things that surround us, and from which strong creative and economic forces can originate from. Repairing is a skill that can enhance independance."

Founding of Collective & Input Exchange


Local Partner Efforts in form of SUB-INITIATIVES\*
